

This list contains the items contained in our CareKit and others you may want to add yourself. Add items as you see the need but be sure to keep it in a location that is accessible in the event of an emergency.

- Alcohol Wipes – use to sanitize hands and equipment. Not to be used on pet
- Antiseptic/Disinfectant Wipes – cleaning/disinfecting cuts, scratches
- Antibiotic Ointment – for topical use on non-emergency small wounds
- Bonding Pouch with window – need one per cage for emergency/evacuation
- Compressed Towel – just add water and it becomes a full size wash cloth
- Corn Starch – to stop minor bleeding, usually occurring when trimming nails
- Cotton Balls – used to check the cage for any sharp areas that may cause a wound
- Cotton Swabs – wound care, applying topical medications, stimulating joey to defecate & urinate
- Duct Tape – used to secure E-Collars and/or secure a splint
- E-Collar: Satellite – for use with heavier sugar gliders and non-cloacal/tail SM
- E-Collar: Shot Glass – for use with normal size sugar gliders, non-cloacal/tail SM
- Electrolyte Replacer (Pedialyte) – minor dehydration, emergency or evacuation use
- Feeding Tip – use on slip tip syringe, for use when force feeding (cannot get sugar glider to open mouth)
- Fleece Blankets – for handling in emergency or burrito to immobilize and allow you to offer the needed care
- Gauze Pad – wound care, wound cover and/or for cleaning
- Hand Sanitizer – to sanitize hands before/after handling. Do not use on Sugar Glider
- Hospital Cage – small, temporary housing in an emergency situation. Emergency size Glide-ariums can be found at SpinZone Global
- Hot pack – emergency travel in cold weather or warm a sick Sugar Glider (use in the zipper pouch)
- Ice pack – emergency travel in hot weather (use in the zipper pouch)
- Lubricating Jelly, Water Soluble – to keep male genitalia moist if not retracting
- Mole Skin & Mole Foam – for use when making an E-Collar
- Nail Clippers – nail trimming
- Saline/Eye Wash – use to flush a wound, not for internal use
- Scissors – clip loose threads, cut bandages, cut the straw, free feet/nails in an emergency
- Straw – place over injured tail, secure with vet wrap to stabilize for transporting to a vet
- Syringes – use when giving oral medications, force feeding or sub-cutaneous fluids
- Tissues – wipe pee or poo
- Travel Carrier – you'll need one that can be secured in a vehicle, not a bonding pouch
- Tweezers – pick ingrown nail from footpad or to hold a stitch for easier removal
- Water Bottle – to offer water when traveling or even use to flush wounds if needed
- Vet Wrap – use for bandaging or covering wounds, to secure a splint or to protect an injured tail. Will stick to itself but not anything else

Items not offered by SpinZone Global

- Bird Feeder/Dispenser – to feed while using an E-Collar
- Bowls – have extras on hand
- E-Jacket – prevent access to wounds or self-mutilation
- Bottle of Water – for emergency/evacuation needs
- Baby Apple Juice – can be used for minor dehydration, pushing fluids, or emergency/evacuation
- Chicken Baby Food – force feed, emergency or evacuation
- Mixed Vegetables Baby Food – force feed, emergency or evacuation

- Lactated Ringers Solution – subcutaneous fluids. Can only be obtained from a vet and proper training is required to administer, this is only temporary supportive care until getting to a vet
- Needles - to administer Sub-Cutaneous fluids, speak with vet for proper size and guide
- List of Perishables and Expiration Dates – check and replace as needed
- Veterinary Records, Health Records, Weight Charts
- Emergency Contact Information

  - Emergency Veterinarian
  - Animal Poison Control
  - Secondary Contact to offer care if needed
